Clara Elizabeth Fletcher, 102, died November 3 at Pine Ridge Nursing Home in Stevensville.

She served on Women's Fellowship, taught Sunday School and sang in the choir. She also served the Mercy Hospital Auxiliary, the Eleanor Club, Women's Federation, Ossoli and Child Study Club. More recently she served on the Lakeland (Pine Ridge) CCC Volunteer Board and as a representative of the Residence Council.

Clara loved and enjoyed her family and friends. She enjoyed knitting, reading, traveling

and cheering for the CUBS.

She was preceded in death by her husband Wayne Fletcher, son Robert Fletcher, her parents Benton and Clara Foust, brothers Zachariah, Benton and Robert Reed Foust, sister Mary Ruth Harrington, son-in-law Thomas Porter, brothers-in-law Riley Harrington and Ira Brown, sisters-in-law Zelma Held, Imogene Brown and Joan Foust.
