Albert "Al" Faultersack, 83, of Benton Harbor, passed away Friday evening, September 24, 2010, at Countryside Nursing Home in South Haven.

Funeral services celebrating his life will be held at 10:00, Wednesday, September 29, at the Fairplain Chapel of Florin Funeral Service, 1053 E.
