She sure took good care of me. I felt she loved me like i was her own. Donald and Margret always welcomed me and treated me with love and kindness. Those memories are the most wonderful of my childhood. You all will always be my family. I miss Don & all the stories he liked to tell me about my dad when he was younger and my grandpa sexton who i never met. I loved setting with him listening to him tell me about my dads younger years. He even told me my mom came to Michigan and worked at a drug store there at one time. That was something none of the Sexton family in indiana or kentucky knew about. I miss making maple syrup with him and the boys. I miss the camp fires, cutting trees with Bobby, and hunting with Tom and Donnie. You guys froze my ass off when you shot those two deer. OMG colder than hell. Ha Ha Ha. I miss going to the farm with uncle Ford. He gave me my first taste of home made wine. I got sick trying to chew

his tobacco in his truck. He laughed and almost wrecked the truck when i accidently swallowed a bunch of chaw! Donald heard about it and laughed and laughed. Donald took me to uncle Ford's farm and let me shoot a hand gun he made. it knocked me and my dad both on our ass. Yea, i had many happy lazy summers up there in wonderland. I will sorely miss one of the greatest men in my life, Donald Sexton.

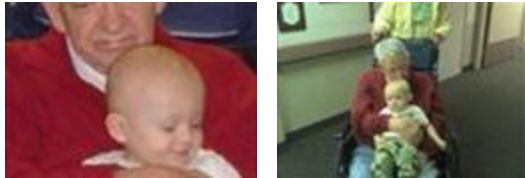
