Gary Spent his life enjoying his work, helping others, nature, trying new things. But his most cherished time was spent with family; especially his children and grandchildren. He was a nice, kind, caring, considerate, generous, humble, honest, hardworking man with an extremely good heart. Notorious for walking everywhere and befriending lots of people everywhere he went.

He often bought food and drinks and gave people money, especially the homeless or less fortunate. He would often offer them jobs assisting him on his projects. He would also donate money to causes such as Habitat for Humanity. He often cared for other peoples pets and stray animals as much as he did for people.

Gary took pride in having graduated from Eau Claire high school in 1975. He enjoyed watching football. He was a fan of U of M, Detroit Lions, and other Michigan teams. He enjoyed playing softball, volleyball, horseshoes, corn hole, billiards, darts, pin ball, and most of all bowling as he was on a league and won many trophies in his younger years. He loved playing online computer games, his favorite being Ultima Online and solitaire. He loved movies; especially action and sci-fi. Some of his favorite movies were Star Wars, Star Trek, Marvel, and DC. He loved classic rock, especially Pink Floyd, and he often listened to 107.1 WIRX. He passionately loved nature, being

outside, and being on the water. He enjoyed piers, lighthouses, fishing, canoeing, and boating. He also loved going to new places, seeing new things, and trying new things, especially new food concoctions he would put together himself. Some of his favorite food and drinks were Mountain Dew, Stroh's beer, tacos, spaghetti, chili, fruit pies, ice cream, and strawberry Twizzlers.

Some of Gary's various occupations included working on the family farm, working at Bosch Braking systems (July 1984-Sept. 2000), where he voluntarily worked overtime so much that his co-workers gave him the nickname "eat em up" because he would eat up all the overtime. He was an overnight stocker at Walmart, often operating lift trucks. He was a temp worker for Premier Tool and Die, Gast, Atlantic Automotive, and JL French. He worked as an inspector, lift truck operator, janitor, and general factory worker until he fell in love with becoming self-employed.

Gary's pride and joy of self-employment included beekeeper, contractor, handyman, carpenter, and doing tree service and landscaping. Some of his most recent projects included remodeling at Nail Couture, Secret Garden, and Hawks Nest in Benton Harbor and Lazer Graphics new location in St. Joseph. He did numerous tree service and landscaping projects with A&B Lawn Services and numbers projects with private individuals who would ask for his help; often resulting in taking on multiple projects and working 3 or more projects at once. He loved his work, fixing things, and helping others.

Gary will be dearly missed by his family and many friends.
