“ My mother raised me as a single parent with help from her mother and grandmother. It was not easy for her at times; she had to work hard to care for her family. She wanted me to stay home and attend SMC for introductory classes and even offered to help me buy a new car but I declined, as tempting as that was, and away I went to Kalamazoo. During those years she took care of my grandmother at home until her passing all the while working many hours. The months following her passing were very difficult, she felt lost, which is about the time she picked up her second job at Family Fare. Her commitment triumphed and she was still there 15 years later. I would sometimes ask her why she still worked there when she was working so many hours at her primary job? She stated simply, “I enjoy talking to the people and seeing my regular customers.” The thing is she truly cared, she shared stories with me about people, conversations they had enjoyed, common interests they had discovered and her heart hurt for those who expressed hardship and illness. While it seems simple, it speaks volumes about her character.

As you heard from the previous letter she worked at Shephard Hardware for 36 years. Even in brutal winters she never complained about the long drive. She even got me a job there one summer. Even though I complained of early alarm clocks, I loved working with her and seeing her in that environment and witnessing all the love people had for her and her love for them. Her work family was very dear to her heart; she spent the majority of her time with them and truly loved each of her coworkers. I heard many fun stories of her shenanigans especially with Lisa and Mike, a couple of her best buds and partners in crime. She also felt your pain during troubled times. I know how hard she worked and never took much time for herself, but it brings me much joy and comfort knowing she was surrounded by such a great group of people who loved her so much.... A group that has subsequently embraced me and showered me and my family with love over the years and especially now.

Over the past 17 years she was dating, and in my mind married to, her partner Don. They had many fun filled times with back and forth banter. Don seemed to have a calming effect on her that mellowed her when she got riled up. They enjoyed vacations up north and a recent trip to Las Vegas.
