R. Nadine Trail, 95, of Benton Harbor went to be with her Lord and her husband, James, on Sunday, June 28, 2020. She passed away peacefully at Royalton Manor Care Facility. The Trail family would like to extend our gratitude to the staff at Royalton Manor for their attentiveness and loving care for many years.

A Celebration of Life service will be held at 11 AM on Thursday, July 2, at the Safe Harbor Church at 3552 S. Pipestone Road in Sodus. The visitation will begin at 10 AM on Thursday at the church. Nadine was born in Center Town, Kentucky October 16, 1924 and was one of six children born to John and Myrtle (Loney) Stevens. The family moved to Michigan in 1936. Nadine challenged herself to go back to school to obtain her GED and she did. She graduated from Lakeshore high School when she was in her 60s. She retired from Sears and Roebuck and was the last founding member and Matriarch of Safe harbor Church of God where she held positions of Women's Missionary leader, Victory Leaders Band Director, and state records clerk.
