“When I first met Rosie Meister in 1996, it was at a Best Friends 4-H Club dog class for youths with disability. Rosie shyly asked me if she could help out with training the children on how to train dogs. I observed that Rosie walked with a crutch and I had a child, Meredith Snyder, who had trouble with walking and would need a calm, patient and slow Team Instructor. Rosie was the right match for her. Both Rosie and Meredith would need a quiet, confident, yet somewhat small size dog to train, so I choose my own Tug-a-Lug Foxmore (Finish Spitz/Chow Chow mix) to be on the team.

Rosie was phenomenal! By the time the Berrien County Youth Fair had arrived, Rosie's canine team was so well versed on each other body language that Tug-A-Lug anticipated Meredith's hand signals, while Rosie's just had to ask Meredith to, "Stop and think. What comes next?"

Rosie was a 4-H Leader for nearly 12 years, before her health finally told her she could not contribute anymore. As part of Best Friends 4-H Club leadership, Rosie and her own Siberian Husky, Amazing Grace, contributed to many a meeting and assisted by experimenting with new ideas on dog training, and sitting with me reviewing and rewriting the 4-H dog class standards for children with disabilities in canine therapy dog competition training program.

Let us not forget that she did the same for the Berrien County Youth Fair's Canine Exhibitor with Disability Judging Program in Canine Obedience and Agility as well.

The 4-H'ers enjoyed her lessons on canine anatomy and dog safety as she would always make it fun to listen and participate, but she never back away from the goals of canine therapy for our 4-H'ers. Rosie was always patient, spoke softly but firmly, and would laugh at any joke the 4-H'er would tell her. She was always there for the 4-H'er in assisting to solve his/her dog training problems and to congratulate them at ringside on what a fine job the team did in the competition ring.

During all of this, especially when I was feeling somewhat down about the progress of Best Friends Canine Therapy Program, Rosie would often say to me, "Linda. When you come t the edge of all the light you know and are about to step off into the darkness of the unknown, FAITH is knowing one of two things will happen. There will be something solid to stand on, or you will be taught how to fly. So... get ready to fly." Then she would nudge me in the right directions. After all ... isn't that what best friends do for each other?

Rosie, with her canine companion, Gracie by her side, accomplished so much in their lifetime. All for the benefit of our 4-H'ers with disabilities.

You will be sorely missed, Rosie. Rest now in God's home. You have earned it.
