Watervliet – Victor Emmanuel Abbott, 69, of Watervliet, passed away on Sunday morning, January 15, 2012, at Lakeland Regional Medical Center in St. Joseph.

Funeral services celebrating his life will be held at 2:00 P.M., Wednesday, January 18, at the Fairplain Chapel of Florin Funeral Service, 1053 E. Napier, in Benton Harbor, with Fr.
